MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL



STUDENT LEADERSHIP AT CEDARS

Over the next week all students from Year 4-12 will be spoken to about student leadership. There are many opportunities for students to step up to leadership at Cedars and take the opportunity to learn new skills, serve others in our community and develop their own character further.

Why is the development of a leadership program so significant for young people?

Growing up is all about learning to accept responsibility, face challenges and develop new skills. Being involved in a developmental leadership program is a valuable way to gain experience and confidence.

What does our program aim to do?

Our student leadership program promotes Christian values, fosters greater community and develops leadership skills. We will look to our student leaders to promote the Christian vision and values of the College. We trust they will create connections with students, staff, parents and community which are positive and encouraging. They will also seek opportunities to grow in their own character, resilience and commitment. The program is designed to help them to welcome opportunities to serve, inspire and empower others.

What do we expect from our Cedars Christian College leaders?

A Christian leader is someone who serves, equips and inspires others for the positive achievement of all. They will reflect the love and grace of Christ.

What are the key features of this program?

One of our aims in the leadership program is to provide meaningful links between the three sub schools. Many of the service opportunities involve linking students across the schools. This means that our College Captains will provide leadership to all students.

The program provides more opportunities for our students to be involved and to select areas of interest

in which they can develop their skills. Because Christian leadership is all about being a servant to others we have identified authentic roles for the students to develop each year. These roles will change and grow with them.

We have a Student Leader Executive team chosen from our Year 11/12 students that will include four School Captains each with a portfolio area: Christian Mission, Sport, Community Events or Mentoring. Because they have designated roles they are able to provide more authentic leadership to our younger students.

How can my son or daughter get involved?

In our Junior School our Year 4 students are already serving in a range of leadership opportunities under the direction of Mrs Clifford. Our Middle School students and Senior College students can be part of the Student Leadership Council with Mr Ramm. Our Year 10 and 11 students have been given nomination forms to complete in the next few weeks to nominate for more formal leadership positions.

How are our School Captains chosen?

There are three steps to the selection of the student executive and all have equal weighting. The first is the completion of an application form which requires the student to reflect upon their own gifts and skills and to speak with a member of staff and their parents about the process. The second is a vote from all students in Middle and Senior College. The final step is an interview with the Principal and key staff. Not all students invited to an interview will be selected for the Executive team; however it will be recognition of their significant potential.

How can I find out more about the Student Leadership Program?

The Student Leadership Booklet is outlined for all students and is available at our College Reception.

I would like to thank our current College Captains for their steady leadership in 2011. We look forward to welcoming our new team of leaders and trust that they will make significant contributions to the life of the school.

DROPPING A STONE IN THE UNIFORM POND

I can only imagine how puzzling it must seem to receive a phone call or a note in the diary about something as seemingly trivial as sock colour, hair length or shoe style.

As students, parents and teachers we make daily decisions about uniform; to what standard we choose to wear it, whether to let our child out the door dressed incorrectly, or how we speak about uniform with our children and each other. Perhaps I, or another teacher walked past your daughter, saw two earrings in her lobe and said nothing. In each of these decisions, we all drop stones in the uniform pond.

Whenever a uniform issue goes unremarked by a teacher or a parent, our individual failure to say something may be taken by students as a collective nod of approval. And it is surprising to learn where some of the ripples lead.

Students often feel an acute sense of unfairness, and don't understand why Teacher X or Parent Y is so 'tough' on uniform while others appear so relaxed. Any attempt to raise lax uniform standards is seen as a 'crack down' or overly harsh.

For parents, it is disheartening to be trumped by those priceless pieces of teenage wisdom: 'But everyone else does it'. Or worse: 'Billy doesn't wear that and Mr Kelly says nothing.' Another: 'Billy's parents don't make him wear that.' I am very conscious of these types of conversations.

For teachers, it undermines their work when one parent continually writes a note for the same thing without attempting to move the issue forward. They know other students and parents are watching.

The uniform policy is not more



important than your child or their education. But the issue of fairness to the majority of students, parents and teachers who value wearing the uniform, for all sorts of reasons of their own, remains our community standard.

Whatever our personal views, when one of us – students, parents or teachers - chooses to drop a stone in the uniform pond, we should at least be aware that the ripples always travel further than we intend.

CSIRO WORKSHOP

CSIRO are coming to conduct a workshop for Yr 9 & 10 on September 1st this Term.

In this new, hands-on program, students will discover the potential of the exciting and emerging field of nanotechnologies. Students will gain an appreciation of processes at the nanoscale, and learn from first hand experience that nanomaterials have different properties compared to bulk materials. They will become more aware of the innovations nanotechnology has brought to areas such as health and medicine, consumer products, energy and the environment.

Demonstrations include the insulating

properties of Pyrogels with the lowest known density of any solid. Examine the unique characteristics of Ferrofluids with nano particles of magnetite suspended in oil, and be amazed by Nano-treated fabrics with useful features such as stain and water resistance.

Hands-on activities include:

Ferrofluid - Compare the properties of nanoparticles of iron oxide to iron filings when a magnetic field is applied.

Carbon Nanotubes - These nanotubes are electrically conducting and exceptionally strong. Discover some of their many uses.

Nano-filtration - Membranes with nano-pores allow you to filter water that is contaminated with even the smallest viruses.

UV protection - Compare and data log UV absorbance of different sized ZnO nanoparticles.

Gold nanoparticle diagnostics - Gold nanoparticles optical properties vary with size and shape. Adding biologically active molecules makes them useful for diagnostics and as drug delivery systems. Use this property to test patient serum samples for bacterial infection.

Glass Coatings - Investigate the self cleaning properties of hydrophobic nano-patterning on glass.

Nano-treated fabrics - Test the stain and water resistance properties of nano-treated fabrics.

Diffraction Patterns from a CD - Calculate the track pitch of the discs by analysing a simple diffraction pattern from this common storage medium.

Sort by size - Gain an understanding of the nano-scale when sorting objects according to their size.

"Our aim while they are here is to give them some joy and help create some new fun memories which they can take back with them when they return home."
